



- Delano faces a variety of fiscal challenges, including state mandates, state takeaways, legislation changes and slow economic recovery
- Council's Goal of establishing and maintaining a desired level of reserves to promote long-term financial stability

Priorities that will be addressed with Measure I Extension


- Preserving current levels in public safety: fire protection, police, crime prevention and investigations

- Conserving city parks, facilities, streets and roads
- Sustaining 15% senior discounts for utility costs
- Subsidize Child Care Facilities for low-income families
- Operations of the Leonard T. Velasco Technology Center
