Problem Oriented-Policing "POP":

I, and Commander Edwards met with the Property Owner for residence located in the 1000 block of Thomas Way, regarding public nuisance associated to tenants and neighboring property. During a week span officers were dispatched to the address on (8) eight separate occasions. *Letters were also sent out to the Property Owners regarding incidents.*

- As the Homeless Liaison Officer for the Police Department, some of my responsibilities are the following (per Policy 425):
 - Maintain a list of the areas within and near this jurisdiction that are used as frequent homeless encampments.
 - Document alternate contact information. This may include obtaining addresses and phone numbers of relatives and friends.
 - Document places the homeless person may frequent.
(Made a roster and documented (33) thirty-three individuals for the month of January).

- Contacted the Responsible Party for 705 S. Lexington Street (Corporation Yard), regarding the ongoing audible alarm activations. From 11/14/2020 to 01/19/2021 a total of (31) thirty-one "Call for Services (CFS)" were generated just solely for audible alarm activations.
 - Contacted the Property Owner for residence located in the 1800 block of 5th Drive, regarding public nuisance associated to tenants. This property came in 3rd place in December 2020 for most "CFS" generated. The property generated a total of (9) nine "Call for Services (CFS)". These calls varied from verbal disturbances, trespassing and other civil issues amongst the tenants. Code Enforcement was made aware of property and was "red tagged" for unsafe to occupy. Letter was also sent out to Property Owner, regarding incidents.
 - Contacted the Property Owner for residence located in the 900 block of Main Street, regarding homeless encampment on property (via letter). Property Owner advised she recently sold the property to someone else and provided new contact information. A letter was then addressed to the new Property Owner regarding encampment.
 - I, Commander Edwards, and Code Enforcement met with the new Property Owners for the residence located in the 900 block of Main Street at their property to assist them with the encampment on the property. Coordinated with the City of Delano for clean-up of the area.
 - Contacted the Property Owner for residence located in the 2400 block of Campania Drive regarding public nuisance, also contacted family members regarding ongoing nuisance.
- Conducted a follow-up with the Delano Recovery Station Administrator about our continued working relationship with the Police Department.
- Contacted Responsible Party for residence located in the 1000 block of Kensington Street at the property, regarding ongoing public nuisance (Trespass).
 - Contacted Property Owner for residence located in the 1400 block of Main Street at the property, regarding ongoing public nuisance (Trespass).
 - Reached out to Bakersfield Flood Ministries regarding Homeless at 900 block of Main Street regarding assistances to relocate
